CORPORATE COMPLIANCE

Lower Cape Fear LifeCare is committed to ensuring that all staff, volunteers, and Board members comply with all ethical and legal obligations and that all services are provided in a manner consistent with accepted standards of practice. To demonstrate this commitment, LCFL has a Compliance Plan to detect, correct, and prevent violations and includes (those pertinent to volunteers):

Standards of Conduct

- volunteers document all services accurately and completely
- volunteers are prohibited from accepting anything of value in return for services
- volunteers are not to use LCFL name/brand/logo without permission
- volunteers respect patient rights and confidentiality
- volunteers must disclose any potential conflict-of-interest issues
- volunteers are encouraged to report compliance concerns to their coordinator

Internal Structure

- LCFL has a 25-member Compliance Committee
- the committee performs scheduled audits/reviews to monitor compliance
- the committee investigates and addresses potential compliance violations
- LCFL provides annual compliance education to staff/volunteers

Hotline

- volunteers can access a Compliance Hotline to report wrongdoing
- the Hotline is an external agency contracted to collect/report issues
- anyone making a report may do so anonymously

- LCFL does not tolerate retaliation again anyone making a report
- the Hotline number is communicated in several ways and available 24/7
