Palliative care is specialized medical care focused on relieving symptoms associated with serious illnesses, such as heart failure, to improve quality of life for patients and their families. Palliative care specialists work together with a patient's other doctors to provide an extra layer of support. It is appropriate at any age and at any stage of a serious illness and can be provided along with curative treatment.

4. Accreditation Corner

As you may have learned way back when, LCFL is accredited by an organization called ACHC. Every three years, ACHC does a survey of our organization to maintain that accreditation. This survey is scheduled to happen in our NC counties sometime in the next four months, so we need to be ready! Here are a few things we as a volunteer department need to know...



1. What is HIPAA? And how do volunteers ensure patient privacy?

- HIPAA is the Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act, a federal law protecting patient privacy.
- Volunteers ensure patient privacy by not disclosing any information about patients verbally, written, or electronically to anyone outside the assigned hospice team members. Volunteers

- should direct any questions related to patients to LCFL staff and/or family members to answer.
- 2. What should a volunteer do if there is suspicion of abuse, neglect, or exploitation of a patient?
 - Contact assigned volunteer coordinator, social worker or nurse to report suspected abuse. The team member may ask for assistance in filing an Event Report. Do not confront family or caregiver directly.

The Volunteer Department also has critical needs in the following areas. If interested in serving in any of these capacities, please contact your local coordinator:

Volunteer Monthly Education

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

LCFL maintains an ongoing Emergency Preparedness Plan (EPP) to organize and mobilize staff and volunteers, and in securing resources, to meet patient needs in the event of an unplanned emergency, disaster, or crisis that threatens to disrupt normal operations and delivery of services. Special emphasis is placed on tropical storms and hurricanes, which have been identified as the most anticipated disaster situations in our geographic area, but may also include other weather conditions, fire, chemical spills, cyber attacks, power outages, security threats, and infection outbreaks.

The Emergency Preparedness Team (EPT), made up of LCFL leadership, will be responsible for assessing the scope of the emergency, communicating information, and coordinating emergency management responses.

The following are important things for volunteers to know regarding emergency preparedness and response:

- * Upon admission, each patient is assigned a priority level that is used in identifying and prioritizing patients (based on needs) in the event of an emergency.
- * Volunteers are to follow the direction of, and to cooperate with, law enforcement

and emergency management personnel regarding travel and communications during any disaster and are NOT to jeopardize their own safety to provide patient care.

- * An Emergency Kit is kept at the reception desk of each office/facility that includes items such as a portable radio, flashlights, paper/pens, first aid supplies, etc. as well as a list of patients for each county.
- * As much as is possible, communications with volunteers will happen via email/text and will be be provided by members of the LCFL Volunteer Department.
- * LCFL maintains contracts with a number of out-of-area hospice facilities, in case there is a need to evacuate patients/families in any of our Care Centers.
- * After the emergency, the EPT will determine a safe time to resume operations and/or re-enter agency offices/facilities.

A Monday-Thursday session for second through fourth graders will be hosted June 19-22, from 8:30 a.m.-1 p.m. at our Home Office. A four-day session will also be hosted June 26-29 for fifth to seventh graders at

the same time and location. There is no charge to attend

Camp Voyager is an opportunity for young people who have experienced the death of someone special. At camp, we will play, laugh, create, make friends and take time to remember the people we know who have died. Campers will meet friends facing similar circumstances, honor the lives of those who have died, learn and laugh, and believe in their own value and the value of their experiences.

We are in need of participants, so please share information freely!

Parents/guardians can get a registration form on our website's grief calendar listing for camp at LifeCare.org. After an application is received, a youth grief counselor will contact the family to determine the appropriateness of this program. Registration is not complete until approved by a counselor.

LAST CHANCE FOR WHITE PANTS GALA

Lower Cape Fear LifeCare's annual gala, Last Chance for White Pants, will be Saturday, Aug. 26, from 7-11 pm at The Hangar at Modern Aviation, 1817 Aviation Drive in Wilmington. Tickets are now on sale,



but limited in number, SO DON'T DODDLE...the event is expected to be a sellout.

"Our annual Last Chance for White Pants Gala is an area favorite fundraiser," Katie Tate, director of foundation, said. "It's far from the traditional sit-down dinner, formal attire fundraising event. The gala, which is always focused on some variation of a beach-party theme, offers guests heavy hors d'oeuvres, cocktails, and dancing while being comfortable in your summer whites — whether that be white pants, jeans, shorts, skirts or dresses — dressed up with a little glam or relaxed with a comfortable brightly-colored shirt or top."

This year, the gala is featuring a new band. <u>The Block Party Experience</u> is a highenergy party band based out of Atlanta. They perform a wide variety of pop favorites that will keep guests on the dance floor all night long.

"We've also got some great auction items for our silent and live auctions, including some exciting experiences like a trip to Big Sky Montana and weekend brunch at Tavern on the Green in New York City," Katie added. "We'll also be conducting our rare bourbon raffle again this year. Those in the community can participate in the silent auction and raffle even if they can't make it to the gala."

The event, known in the community as everyone's favorite end-of-summer celebration supports the nonprofit's mission to ensure that local individuals and families living with a life-limiting illness have access to the care and support, regardless of their ability to pay. This year, a large portion is being designated for the agency's Memory Partners dementia care program.

Memory Partners is a consultation-based program that provides caregivers of loved ones living with Alzheimer's or other dementia-related illness the education, resources, and support needed to improve quality of life for the entire family. The program offers support groups, education opportunities, and regular evaluations to determine when other care services, such as palliative or hospice care, may be appropriate. One of the most essential parts of the program is in providing respite care. Funds raised will help LCFL provide the respite care that family caregivers desperately need.

Tickets are \$200 per person and can be purchased on the event's website WhitePants.org.
