3. Looking ahead to 23-24

As you probably read last month, Lower Cape Fear LifeCare recently closed out our fiscal year, 2022-2023. In October's newsletter, we listed the Top Ten (plus one) goals for this coming year. Go check it out, if you missed all the BIG things in store for the volunteer department!



That said, we wanted to also take the opportunity to share a recap of this past year, as it was filled with amazing work as we sought to revitalize our volunteer program. Here are the Top Ten (plus one) accomplishments...

- 1. We ended the year with 295 active volunteers, more than a 230% increase since this time last year.
- 2. We provided new volunteer orientations to more than 180 people.
- 3. Volunteers contributed more than 17,000 total hours to our patients, families, facilities, and events. Our last quarter's volunteer utilization rate was 7.81% in NC and 4.37% in SC.
- 4. Volunteers donated nearly 150,000 miles during their service.
- Monthly support meetings have seen their greatest attendances since before COVID. More than 75 volunteers participated in National Volunteer Week activities.

- 6. Over 80% of the front desk shifts are covered by volunteers at all three Care Centers.
- 7. We have more pet therapy teams than ever before.
- 8. We participated in the agency accreditation audit with no volunteerrelated deficiencies. Volunteers continue to remain compliant at a rate fo 95%.
- 9. LCFL added Robeson County to our service area and the volunteer department gained five new wonderful folks to our team.
- 10. Volunteers played a much more significant role in fund raising events, supporting the Festival of Trees, quarterly tile ceremonies, and other development and outreach activities.
- 11. And as mentioned above, we achieved Level 5 in the We Honor Veterans program.

Volunteer Monthly Education

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

I know, I know...this is probably not the most exciting monthly educational topic, but it is still important for you, our volunteers, to know and understand the array of LCFL policies and procedures that have to do with our department. So, sit back grab a beverage, and enjoy some volunteer P&P highlights.

Active Volunteerism

Volunteers are considered to be active in the following circumstances:

- the volunteer has provided any volunteer service during the past quarter
- the volunteer's personnel record is current and compliance requirements are met
- the volunteer followed all agency policies and procedures

Volunteer Selection

Selection of volunteers is based on the completion of the following requirements:

- application, including an acceptable criminal background check
- completion of volunteer orientation and initial competencies
- TB blood screen
- a review of agency policies and procedures
- an interview and observation by LCFL Volunteer Department staff

Please note that documentation of a COVID vaccination is no longer a requirement for volunteer participation.

Volunteer utilization

LCFL will document and maintain a volunteer staff sufficient to provide services in an amount that, at minimum, equals 5% of the total patient care hours of all paid hospice

employees. The 5% cost savings will be calculated separately for North Carolina and South Carolina, due to individual state requirements.

Also, following the death of a loved one, it is recommended that surviving family members wait a minimum of one year before becoming a patient care volunteer.

Volunteer documentation

All volunteer hours and patient/family contacts are to be documented per established processes and should be submitted no later than one week after the date of service.

Other policies/procedures of note

Did you know?

- Volunteers are asked to NOT transport patients and family members.
- Volunteers must wear their official LCFL name tag (badge) when serving.
- Volunteers are NOT to feed patients.
- LCFL maintains an annual dollar value of volunteer hours/mileage contributed.
- Volunteers coordinate with LCFL social workers on patient assignments.
- For most requirements, volunteers are considered like LCFL staff!
